As we happily resuming public Masses today in our diocese, please note the following rules that will apply at least for now, and kindly cooperate with them so that working together, all will feel safe, and we can speed up the day we can get back to normal. 1. While public Masses have resumed, the elderly, and those with underlying health conditions are asked to follow the most up to date health regulations and consider remaining at home. There are many who might feel uncomfortable returning to Mass. They, too, have legitimate reason to remain at home. Bishop Tobin has extended the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further notice.
2. **Hand hygiene:** All attendees are encouraged carry with them their own sanitizing wipes for use as needed. Parishioners should sanitize their hands prior to entering the church.
3. A **mask** must be worn at all times, with the exception of receiving Holy Communion.
4. A **Distance** of at least six feet from others must be maintained, with the exception of members of one’s own household.
5. **Singing is limited** to the organist/cantor to avoid increased aerosolized particles. Hymnals have been removed temporarily.
6. Social distancing must be maintained in line to **receive Holy Communion**. Lower your mask just before reaching the priest. Communion may be received on the hand or on the tongue. One need not receive if fearful of contracting the virus.
7. **The Sign of Peace** remains suspended. Before and following Mass avoid unnecessary personal unnecessary contact with anyone.
8. **The sick must stay home.** Anyone who has symptoms of any sickness (even mild symptoms) may not attend the public celebration of Mass.
